Executive Director

Sunny Mulford is a co-founder of Epic Cure[®], Sustain U.[®], her latest effort in a long history of charitable acts that include CASA training and mentoring and housing underprivileged children. At Epic-Cure, Sunny is responsible for all operations, covering food sourcing, logistics (5 refrigerated box trucks and a refrigerated van), two warehouses, 400 volunteers, and 1.2M to 1.4M pounds of food processed monthly across 19 weekly free food distributions in LMI neighborhoods. Sunny leads by example and is a strong advocate for Epic-Cure's volunteers and beneficiaries, regularly assisting them in discovering new resources to improve their social, economic, and health outcomes.

For more than 17 years, Sunny has worked in financial services as an auditor for insurance companies. Since early 2016, she has managed audits on global casualty accounts for Fortune 100 and Fortune 500 companies as a Senior Auditor for Chubb Insurance (Atlanta, GA). Prior to working for Chubb, she worked as a Supervising Auditor for Premium Audit Services (Fairfield, NJ) and as a Field Auditor and Audit Review Professional for Charles Hock Associates (Clifton Park, NY).

Additionally, Sunny has been the Director of Finance for Rebar Capital LLC[®], a commercial real estate lending and investing business she co-founded with her husband Ken. An IRS Enrolled Agent (Certification, 2002), she has been admitted to practice before the Internal Revenue Service. She serves as Rebar Capital's Tax Matters Partner.

Ken Mulford

Managing Director

Ken Mulford is Epic-Cure's Co-Founder and Managing Director. He holds the officer titles of Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. His responsibilities include corporate governance, strategic planning, and fundraising. He chairs the Executive and Nominating Committees of the Board of Directors of Epic-Cure® and even manages several food distributions each month. Ken is currently in charge of the \$6.5M building project, a cold storage and production kitchen facility that will more than double Epic-Cure's throughput when completed and fully operational (targeted for 2027).

Ken has more than 30 years' experience in financial services. He has wide and deep knowledge of debt capital markets, securitized products, and credit. In recent years, Ken has focused most of his work in residential and commercial mortgage production, serving as an Executive Vice President and Head of Capital Markets for a national direct residential mortgage lender (Sun West Mortgage) and as the Managing Director in charge of Commercial Mortgage Lending and Capital Markets of a national thrift (The Federal Savings Bank). In these roles, Ken was responsible for originating mortgages, recruiting and supervising loan officers and branch managers, establishing new retail branches nationwide, raising capital, and managing large bank relationships.

Prior to his most recent roles, Ken spent 25 years as a Wall Street professional in securitized products. Working for such firms as Merrill Lynch, Salomon Smith Barney, JP Morgan, and UBS, he became expert in securitization banking – cash flow modeling, deal execution, and relationship management – and mortgage whole loan trading and finance. Though his primary focus was in mortgage related securitizations (ABS HEL, RMBS, and CMBS), Ken also gained expertise in other consumer asset classes such as Credit Cards, Auto Loans, Auto Leases, Tax Liens, and Student Loans.

After graduating in 1985 with Honors from the College of Wooster (Wooster, Ohio), Ken began his career in finance as a commercial lending officer with formal credit training (Southeast Bank NA). He interrupted his career to earn his master's degree in Philosophy in 1992 from Columbia University in New York City, where he was a President's Fellow. Ken proudly holds the Chartered Financial Analyst® designation.

Ken lives in Saint Augustine Beach, Florida, with his wife Sunny and his son Kenneth.

Wilson G. Bradshaw, Ph.D.

President Emeritus, Florida Gulf Coast University

Biography

Wilson G. Bradshaw, Ph.D. served as President of Florida Gulf Coast University (FGCU) from 2007 to June 30, 2017 when he retired as president. On August 25, 2007, the Florida Gulf Coast University Board of Trustees unanimously selected Dr. Bradshaw to become the institution's third President. During his tenure, FGCU experienced tremendous growth in both size and complexity. In recognition of Dr. Bradshaw's decade of distinguished service, the university awarded him President Emeritus status and in October of 2019, the Florida Gulf Coast University Board of Trustees unanimously voted to approve the naming of the university library as "**The Wilson G. Bradshaw Library.**"

President Bradshaw came to FGCU from Metropolitan State University in Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota, where he served for seven years as President. His previous academic administrative positions included Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania, Vice President and Dean for Graduate Studies and Research at Georgia Southern University, and Dean of Graduate Studies at Florida Atlantic University. During his tenure as President, Dr. Bradshaw served on the Board of Directors of the Friends of the Saint Paul Library, the United Way of the Twin Cities, the Saint Paul Police Foundation, the Bush Foundation, the Minnesota Foundation, Securian Financial, Inc (A corporate Board of Directors) and the Richard M. Schulze Family Foundation. Currently, Dr. Bradshaw serves on the Board of the Friends of the Main Branch of the St. Johns County Public Library.

Born in Sanford, Florida, and raised in West Palm Beach, Dr. Bradshaw earned his Ph.D. in neuroscience (psychobiology) from the University of Pittsburgh. He was awarded a National Institute of Health Post-Doctoral Fellowship in the Laboratory of Neural and Endocrine Regulation at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). As a scholar and researcher, Dr. Bradshaw earned the rank of full professor.

President Emeritus Bradshaw and his wife, Jo Anna, now reside in Saint Augustine. The Bradshaws have three adult sons.

Early work was in ICU and CCU units, then 18 years as a clinically certified research coordinator in adult cardiology. She worked as a Clinical Specialist in Hematology and was the manager of the Nursing Education Department at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. She was an assistant professor at Clemson University, adjunct faculty for University of TN Health Science Center, Georgetown University, independent consultant with Flagler Hospital, Pearson Education, Inc., & The Law Offices of Craig & Lofton.
